
SUMMARY OF SERVICES

Agency Management

OBJECTIVE 1: Rapidly and efficiently respond with un-mobilized units to contingency requests from the Executive Office of the Mayor, to provide military, emergency, and community support as prescribed in the District of Columbia Emergency Response Plan.

OBJECTIVE 2: Ensure timely support to the District Government during emergencies, civil disturbances, and natural disasters.

INITIATIVE 2.1: Renovate the DC National Guard Armory.

• **Response**: Renovate the Armory to serve as a shelter in the event of a Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) attack or natural disaster. The revocation of the DC National Guard are ongoing projects.

OBJECTIVE 3: Increase the number of applicants etc.

INITIATIVE 3.1: Sustain an About Face youth program.

Response:

Reestablish and sustain an About Face youth program (90 students per year) in the Armory. As a result 159 students completed the program.

The initiative was Fully Achieved (100% completed)

INITIATIVE 3.2: Establish a STARBASE program.

Response: This federally funded program is designed to encourage youth between the ages of 6 and 18 to stay in school and pursue mathematics and science curricula. There were no funds allocated. The initiative was **Not Achieved** (less than 75% completed)

INITIATIVE 3.4: Sustain Youth Challenge program.

Response: This partially federally funded program teaches basic life skills and work habits. Continue to search for DC based facility to house this program on an annual basis.

The initiative was **Partially Achieved** (between 75% to 99.99% completed)
