*Mission:* The mission of the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Public Safety and Justice is to provide direction, guidance, support, and coordination to the Districts public safety agencies, and to develop and lead interagency public safety initiatives that improve the quality of life in the Districts neighborhoods.

*Services:* The Office of Deputy Mayor for Public Safety and Justice was created in January 2011 to provide guidance, support, and coordination of public safety and justice agencies of the District.
