









## Summer Blitz

- ◆Summer Priorities include:
  - Closing out work orders to significantly reduce the backlog going into SY18-19
    - •Currently contractors have begun pricing and establishing schedules to close out 200+ backlog tickets over the next 30 days
    - Need to develop plan to address the rest of the backlog
    - •Initial focus on life safety issues
  - DGS to work with DCPS to develop a standardized process to 'refresh' and update schools on a schedule each summer, depending on when the school was last modernized and based on available budget
  - Process should be standardized and scheduled to ensure equitable repairs and upgrades in schools across the District



## Transportation: Kids Ride Free

New program provides SmarTrip Cards for students. Goals of change are to reduce barriers to use and the challenges of activating the cards.

The Kids Ride Free Working Group is working through the following issues:

## Eligibility

- a) 32,000 cards provided; 73,896 eligible DCPS & PCS students
  - ~28,000 students using One Card this year
- Determining selection criteria if demand exceeds supply
- Finalizing access to the bus and rail for students without the card

#### Implementation

- a) Finalizing transition plan to new process and determine impact on schools during the summer
- Planning for a late summer / early fall distribution process
- Likely \$3M+ spending pressure for current program in FY19

## School Safety: SROs, Security Guards, and Door Locks

#### **SROs**

- Service DCPS and PCS
- Specialized training and experience in working with youth
- Two shifts:
  - 9 am to 5:30 pm
  - •12:30 pm to 9:00 pm

#### Security Guards

- In addition to SROs, contract security at DCPS schools
- Due to school configurations, no. of guards is increasing: 313 at beginning of SY17, 326 at the end, and 338 proposed in SY18
- Deployment based on building size, student population, and number of incidents in the school

#### **Door Locks**

- DCPS estimates that ~50 schools have doors that need to be addressed\*
- DGS expects to complete their assessment by May 15.
- Agencies will work together to consider and prioritize the various aspects and resources that increase security at our schools, including security personnel, infrastructure enhancements, mental health support, and others



<sup>\*</sup>An additional 16 schools have classrooms that need interior locks, but are undergoing or starting modernization within this year



## Health / Wellness: School Health Services

#### School Health Services

- As of May 2018, 100% of schools with an approved health suite receive 40 hours of coverage
  - All DCPS + 85 Public Charter Campuses
  - 2 additional public charter schools in health suite approval process
- FY18 \$4.5M spending pressure
- Coverage continues in open health suites during the summer

- Ongoing recruiting and hiring to handle expected staff turnover during summer
- Well-child visit marketing campaign to launch by early June to promote annual check-up and return of Universal Health Certificate (UHC)
- Review of UHCs

- ◆In SY 18-19, DBH Clinicians maintain current multi-tiered role in schools
- ◆Capacity is 63 schools. Currently hiring for 5 vacancies.

- ◆The top 25% of schools (~50) with the highest behavioral health needs will be prioritized
- ◆FY19 DBH Budget includes \$3M additional funds to fund expansion including:
  - Grant funding to community-based behavioral health providers
  - 5 additional term DBH Clinicians
  - Community of Practice
  - Evaluation of first year implementation
- ◆Funding is available after 10/1/18, after beginning of SY





## Citywide Attendance Campaign

#### Back-to-School Citywide Campaign

- ◆Educate and engage students and families around transitions to prevent spikes in absenteeism
- ◆DME and DCPS targeted messaging and outreach for Kindergarten and 9<sup>th</sup> grades



Every Day Counts! School Year 2018-19 Ongoing Work:

- Community Attendance Action Planning
  - School/community teams receive 1-on-1 coaching for developing attendance strategies
- ◆ Cross-Sector Attendance Community of Practice
  - Schools from DCPS and public charters meet monthly to share promising practices on attendance
- ◆ Data Sharing Expansion

OCA plans to convene an Attendance STAT in the fall.

## Next steps in advance of SY18-19 start

#### **CapSTAT**

- ◆ Meet again for a midpoint check in in June;
- ◆Schedule another CapSTAT for July

#### **Facilities Readiness**

- ◆DGS work with DCPS, DCRA, OCTO and DOH to complete school modernizations and small cap projects and prepare for school year start
- ◆DGS to work with DCPS to develop a plan to address the backlog of work orders and new work orders as they come in
- ◆DGS to work with DCPS and OCA to develop a long term plan for 'summer blitz' work, to include work orders and school refresh
- ◆DGS to work with OCA to develop a tracking mechanism for capital projects to report and alert stakeholders if timing is off track
- ◆Develop case management process for facilitating PCS requests to DC agencies

#### **Transportation and Safety**

- ◆Finalize plans for Kids Ride Free rollout determine eligibility, distribution and communication
- ◆DGS finalize plan for door locks

#### **Health and Wellness**

- ◆DC Health launches well-child campaign and continues planning full-time health suite coverage
- ◆DBH continue coordinating council on mental health and plan for next steps and expansion

#### **Attendance**

- ◆DME and DCPS continue to work on strategies to support students attendance in schools
- Schedule Attendance STAT for the fall






DCPS Work Orders Spike at Beginning and End of School Year
